President Report

As I mentioned at our presentation evening, please do not be afraid to get involved in the club in some capacity and do not be afraid to volunteer your services. Please do not think you have nothing to offer or that your ideas will not be listened to or respected. Nothing could be further from the truth. please do not wait to be asked or tapped on the shoulder, just get involved.

As a result, the club through the committee must be very prudent in the area of financial management. As a club we must continue to grow our income streams.

The men's program must continue to develop and improve and we wish new coach Chris Box and his team the very best of luck for the forthcoming season. Likewise, the women's program must continue to grow and flourish and we welcome Scott Shepherd and Senior Assistant Coach Amy Vine to the club and also wish them all the best for season 2023/24.

Our relationships with both Cricket Victoria and the VSDCA are excellent and highlighted by the fact that our opinions are valued and respected in the cricket community.

As a club I feel it is appropriate that we congratulate Harrison Smyth and Mackinley Blows, both former (and hopefully future), Box Hill CC players on their winning of this year's Ryder and Una Paisley medals at the Cricket Victoria awards.

In Harrison's speech, he acknowledged the contribution that our club made in his development not only as a player but also as a person.

Treasurer Report

For the Season 2022/23 the Box Hill Cricket Club recorded a \$21,915 loss. This result compares with a \$2,939 loss recorded in the season prior (2022/22).

Although a loss position was expected, this considerable loss position can be attributed to a number of challenging factors coming out of the first full year from COVID, but additionally positive factors that will bode well for the club going forward.

We note the below factors were COVID-19 related changes that has impacted the club financially compared to prior years:

- The ground rental fees in past two prior years have been partly waived (\$6,125 and \$15,170 in FY22 and FY21 respectively). For FY23 there was no waiving of fees, and the balance of the outstanding fees have now been paid.
- No COVID-19 related grants were received in FY23 (compared to \$9k over the past 2 years)

Additionally, we note that the following extraordinary events incurred during the year which was not originally planned for:

- Increased cricket equipment purchases for both match day and training. This is due minimal purchasing in prior years and poor quality stock previously on hand.
- All expenditure significantly increasing in prices by approximately 10% compared to previous years.
- 2 sponsors no longer committing to the club for the year.

The committee has made decisions over the last 12 months to ensure that the growth of the players and the club is at the highest priority. As a result, a focus of expenditure during the year has been on coaching for both men's, women's and junior programs, embracing technology by investing in Frogbox and Square and moving away from previous processes that have been not only time-consuming but have caused operational problems for the club and its members along the way.

Overall, revenue has increase significantly by \$32,802 to \$149,987. A great achievement contributed by increased participation numbers (particularly juniors) and opening of the bar and other social activities generating revenue, which has increased from prior years. Despite cricket participant numbers trending downwards across the State, the club saw an increase in participating numbers from a junior level, which also contributed to a strong senior numbers across both programs.

The Club continues to rely heavily on the support of Cricket Victoria through agreed Cricket Expense Reimbursements (\$42,282) and Strategic Activity Funding (\$7,000), the latter supporting the Club's investment in the Meg Lanning Academy and junior development program. The Club wishes to thank Cricket Victoria for its continued strong support of its Women's cricket program and efforts to drive further participation by females of all ages. We note that the requirement is for 100% of the grants received to be spent on cricket-related activity for our players.

The lack of third-party Sponsorship is a continuing concern and needs to be a key focus of not just the Committee, but the Box Hill Cricket Club community – please approach the Committee with ideas and suggestions. The goal for the club is to return to pre-covid period of level sponsorship and driving greater relationships with the community. This has been a main focus of the committee and already have more confirmed sponsors for FY24 compared to the FY23.

Other notable changes were an increase in subscriptions in terms of expenditure, where running costs for new technology now being recognised monthly. The club is continuing to apply for all relevant state and local grants to help upskill members and maintain the conditions of club.

Social & Fundraising profits (increased by \$6,195) were benefited by the easing of regulations and opening of social club rooms during the season on the back-end of the COVID lockdowns, as well as a change in supplier. We also note that the move from EFTPOS to Square has assisted in the ease of cashless transactions and have had positive feedback from members, whilst also saving on transaction costs. Would like to thank Tom Barrelli greatly for his assistance in setting this up.



The overall expenditure increase for the year was significant, showing the overall up-keep required to run the club, but more importantly improve the club.

However as mentioned, ground rental fees increased from prior year with no rental fees being waived by the Whitehorse City Council.

The key increases were driven by a longer cricket season than prior year seen by increased curator costs (\$1,560), planning and fundraising expenses (\$2,976), player and coaching payments and cleaning and materials. The cleaning and materials is one item that has been recognised as at significantly poor standards, particularly at Springfield Oval.

Further expenditure has been required by the club to maintain high standards to provide clean facilities to all our members and their families and visiting opponents.

For FY24, although some expenditure is likely to maintain at similar levels, there are a number of items that we see as once-offs and have budgeted at a stricter level to ensure we adhere to our plans. Any increase costs we believe will be naturally funded by additional revenue.

The Club's cash position has decreased to approximately \$15k. The main reason behind this is to pay off all our liabilities by year-end, particularly the prior year ground rental fees from the council, as well as funding the loss for the year. As mentioned above, the key focus' the committee has recognised is to increase 3rd party sponsorship, as well as procedures in place to stick to all budgeted amounts. Additionally, it was recognised that it is integral that relationships with Box Hill Cricket Club are kept at a

high standard, therefore liabilities were to be all paid on time to any suppliers.

In summary, Season 2022/23 saw a loss, however with the club's focus on embracing technology, and investing into coaching and facilities for our players, we believe that the investment will be recognised on the bottom line in years to come in a positive manner.

The club has been extremely prudent in managing its expense line for some time now and will continue to seek ways to "do things better". If we wish to grow our cricket program (men, women and juniors), continue to enhance the coaching we offer and invest in our players, we must grow the Club's income streams quite significantly for next season and into the foreseeable future.

On behalf of our members, I thank all our valued sponsors and partners, particularly the continued support of Fashion Clubwear and The Athlete's Foot. We also appreciate the support of new sponsors and partners and looking forward to building further on our current relationships with these sponsors.

Several members of the Box Hill Cricket Club Community also supported the Club through donations. Your greatly appreciated support assists the club in delivering programs and initiatives to benefit our Juniors, Senior Women and Senior Men.

Women's Head Coach Report

With a new coaching panel assembled, we combined both outdoor activities with indoor nets and were both ready and prepared to hit the ground running alas inclement weather played its part and we were restricted in games played early in the season.

We produced mixed results across all grades throughout the T20 phase of our season however fared well upon the commencement of the One Day format with outstanding performances from Holly Spencer 5/16, Pennie Harrison 107 and Eloise Wood 69 & 4/27.

Our 2ndXI under the helm of new Coach Steve Watling produced encouraging results throughout the pre-Christmas period whilst our 3rdXI led by Marg Pretty and Nicole Breschkin provided opportunity to both experienced and inexperienced players alike and Jess Alvaro ensured that our 4thXI remained competitive on a weekly basis.

Upon the recommencement of the season as with many clubs we struggled to maintain playing numbers which unfortunately resulted in the forfeiture of our 4thXI however the silver lining was that younger players were exposed to higher grade Premier cricket which they acquitted themselves well in.

Our 1stXI season gathered momentum throughout the back end of the season which saw us enter the finals having won 4 games in a row on the back of performances from Captain Anna Lanning 73 and 97, and Maddie Wright 59 no.

Undoubtedly, our finest victory of the season came when our 1stXI were able to defend 116 against reigning Premier Melbourne CC where remarkably we took 10/47 with Isa White enjoying the spoils returning 5/22.

Our 2ndXI lost ground on the top 4 late in the season when being defeated in a couple of close games however Katherine Dekel enjoyed some success with 67 no whilst evergreen Nicole Breschkin also compiled 56 contributing strongly to a victory for the 3rdXI.

Concluding the Home & Away season in 3rd place on the ladder and earning a home Semi Final our 1stXI were opposed to Melbourne CC and despite the best efforts of both Maddie Wright 62 and Holly Spencer 52, we were defeated by 14 runs.

Considering the obstacles presented to us as a club throughout season 2022/23 we can still take a great deal of pride in the knowledge that our 1stXI again qualified for finals whilst all our XI's remained competitive and provided all players with an opportunity to represent our great club playing a game that we love.

Women's First XI Report

With a young group the 1st XI had an up and down year in terms of results but there were lots of positives to take into next year.

We chased down 98 comfortably with great contributions from youngsters Yashoda and Isa. Another 2 washouts saw us through to the end of November without much cricket played. A great win against Carlton saw us post 193 and restrict them to 114, with some great team bowling efforts.

Again, we struggled to find form and finished off the T20 part of the season in December with 3 losses.

It was great to have Jo Gardner back at the club, to bring some experience and knowledge to our young group. She struck 51 against Carlton in the first game back after Christmas. Holly Spencer was outstanding all year with the ball and again had 2/17 off 10 overs, whilst Vaish grabbed 3/30 off 7 overs. Vaish improved throughout the season with every ball she bowled.

We then got on a roll and won our last 4 matches to make finals for another year. We defeated Plenty Valley, Dandenong, Melbourne and Ringwood in that run.
