Treasurer's Report

For the Season 2020/21, the Box Hill Cricket Club recorded a \$2,498 profit. This result compares with a \$4,124 loss recorded in the season prior (2019/20). The profit position for the year is a good result considering the challenges of COVID however was in large part a result of the Whitehorse City Council waiving ground rental fees for half of the season (\$15,170) and COVID-related Grants (\$8,000) which offset the reduction in Social / Fundraising revenue and Subscriptions.

Like the rest of the community, the Club faces significant near-term challenges from COVID-19 and continues to engage with key stakeholders regarding the potential financial impacts on players and the Club. In particular, the Club would like to thank the Whitehorse City Council's financial support through waiving of ground rental fees and the Whitehorse Recovery Grant (\$4,500).

Overall revenue decreased by \$15,090 to \$117,663. The Club continues to rely heavily on the support of Cricket Victoria through agreed Cricket Expense Reimbursements (\$31,181) and Strategic Activity Funding (\$5,000), the latter supporting the Club's investment in the Meg Lanning Academy and junior development program. The Club wishes to thank Cricket Victoria for its continued strong support of its Women's cricket program and efforts to drive further participation by females of all ages.

The lack of third-party Sponsorship is a continuing concern and needs to be a key focus of not just the Committee but the Box Hill Cricket Club community – please approach the Committee with ideas and suggestions. Whilst Bendigo Bank decided not to provide the club with an upfront sponsorship payment in FY21, they continue to offer the Club an incentive package as well as providing a COVID Relief Grant (\$2,000). The Club thanks Bendigo Bank for their continued support and we hope to build the relationship throughout the Club community.

Notable changes in income versus the season prior were a decrease in Subscriptions (\$3,169) and Prize Money from Cricket Victoria (\$1,000). The Club invested significantly in the Meg Lanning Academy which was mostly funded by fees (\$8,535) and Cricket Victoria Activity Funding. Jason McNulty

should be commended on the huge effort he undertook to organise and manage this program under constantly changing conditions. The Club was also able to secure a number of COVID relief grants – \$4,500 from Whitehorse City Council, \$2,000 from Bendigo Bank and \$1,500 from the Victorian Government's Community Sport Sector COVID-19 Short-Term Survival Package.

Social & Fundraising profits (reduced by \$7,560) were significantly impacted by COVID restrictions throughout the season. I would like to personally thank the assistance provided by Michelle Winterton for managing the bar as well as the never-ending assistance provided by Brant Hubber across a number of areas at the Club.

Overall expenses decreased by \$21,712. As mentioned, ground rental fees for half the season (\$15,170) were waived by Whitehorse City Council. The key increases were driven by the increased investment in the Meg Lanning Academy (\$9,971), umpire fees (\$2,133) being charged directly by Cricket Victoria and the Eastern Cricket Association and once-off equipment expenditure. The Club invested in a mower for Springfield Park (\$1,350) and software upgrades to the City Oval scoreboard (\$4,150) to provide functionality for cricket scoring and messaging. Both of these expenditures were classified as operating expenses impacting upon profit for the year. Noting that Donations of \$2,000 were provided by the Box Hill Cricket Club Community to part-fund the expenditure on the scoreboard.

Savings were made in some areas however a number were COVID-related disruptions and will be required expenditure in FY22. This includes a reduction in pre-season / indoor training costs (\$4,809), clothing (\$3,613) and light / power / cleaning (\$2,688). There will be increased cost pressure during FY22 that will need to be funded by additional revenue.

The Club's cash position increased by \$9,245 to \$45,311. The key contributors to the difference between cash and accounting profit for FY21 were the decrease in stock (\$5,304) and in particular the utilisation of the high level of balls held at 30 June 2020 and the increase in pre-paid revenue (\$1,230) which largely represents the collection of Meg Lanning Academy Fees in advance.

In summary, Season 2019/20 saw a minor profit however this was largely a result of COVID relief measures from Whitehorse City Council and accessing Grants. The club has been extremely prudent in managing its expense line for some time now and will continue to seek ways to "do things better". If we wish to grow our cricket program (men, women and juniors), continue to enhance the coaching we offer and invest in our players, we must grow the Club's income streams quite significantly for next season and into the foreseeable future.

On behalf of our members, I thank all our valued sponsors and partners, particularly the Surrey Hills Community Bank Branch of the Bendigo Bank and the continued support of Fashion Clubwear. A number of members of the Box Hill Cricket Club Community also supported the Club through donations. Your greatly appreciated support assists the club in delivering programs and initiatives to benefit our Juniors, Senior Women and Senior Men.

Men's Cricket Report

The men's program began the 2020/21 season full of hope after securing highly credentialled coach Richard Armstrong from Ringwood CC. Despite losing a few talented players, Richard was able to recruit many young players from local cricket that would help bolster our stocks with a view to the future, most particularly Josh Barr who would take the reins as 2s skipper.

Ryan Webster, who stood down as coach due to work and football commitments, was re-appointed as 1sts skipper, Josh Barr as 2s captain, Peter Robertson/Nick Kenealy as 3s and Steve Flinn/Sam Morris as 4s.

The season was always going to be different than the past, with COVID issues condensing the season somewhat into 13 one day matches.

Round I - Highlights

Both the 1st and 2nd XI's had disappointing losses to Mt Waverley but the 3s were able to chase down 195 thanks mainly to a run-a-ball 63 from return player Brant Hubber and 2/29 plus 23 from Luke Myszka. Tristan Wainright picked up Man of the Match honours in the 4ths win where they defended 169, with a fantastic 32 and 3/33. Even old timers Ken Trollope (3/22) and Glen Comte (31) proved they still have plenty of good cricket left in them.

Round 2 - Highlights

The 1sts secured their first win for the year. Posting 146, mainly thanks to Blake Nikolic's 47 and AB Siddiqui's 36, was enough as Balwyn crumbled to our even improving bowling line up. Sam Kimber kicked off his year to remember with 4/22, AB Siddiqui secured Man of the Match honours with 3/4 off 6 overs and Mohammed Saeed 3/13.

The 2nds posted 165 with the promoted Brant Hubber continuing his excellent start to the season with 46 (35) and Brendan King proving he has allrounder qualities with 38* (46). Balwyn could only manage 147 in reply with skipper Josh Barr leading the way with 4/32 and the big Moose, Moiz Khan snagging 3/30.

The 3s score of 150 was never enough despite Luke Myszka's 62 (82) with Balwyn chasing down the total with 11 balls to spare, despite Michael Vozzo's swing masterclass of 3/14.

The 4s accounted for Balwyns 133 easily only losing 4 wickets in the chase down. Adam Joseph snagged 2/29 whilst Dave Carter 36 (37) and Sam Blake 23* (15) ensured victory with the bat.

Round 3 - Highlights

Taking on Caulfield was always going to be tough and with us scoring 150 in the ones we knew that was going to be a little light. Ryan Webster was our main stay with 54* (77). Despite a minor stumble by the Caulfield bats, they were able to secure victory with 3 overs to spare.

On the other hand, the 2s couldn't have been more impressive rolling Caulfield for just 77 with Michael Barro and Peter Robertson snagging 3 each. Brant Hubber and Liam Dick ensured victory scoring 30 each to enable the target was reached in just 21 overs.

Unfortunately, the 3rds were easily beaten despite 30's from Kyle Brand and Nathan Flinn.

The 4s posted a huge 215 thanks mainly to Sam Blake 74* and Luke Kukuruzovic 68 with Caulfield managing just 164 in reply.

Round 4 - Highlights

After being 4/50 the ones were in trouble, but young gun Jack McLaren in just his 2nd 1st XI game joined Tom Newman at the crease against Noble Park. They proceeded to steady the ship and then clip Noble Parks spin line up around the ground to see us to a respectable 178 with Newy 62 (60) and Jack 45* (69). Noble Park were rolled for 120 with Nikolic and Moose snaring 3 each in what was a great win.

The 2s lost a close one. Our 145 score was not enough despite the return of Raj Kumar with 49 (75) and Ben Horsnaill's 30* (32), Noble got the win with just 1 wicket in hand. Parth Mehta was awesome with 4/38.



The 3s loss was not without a great display by Will Hazeldine who snared 5/30 and Sam Alberico with 37 with the bat.

The 4s continued their winning form chasing down Noble Parks 160 with Glenn Comte smashing a brilliant 89* off just 93 balls.

Round 5 - Highlights

The Is took on Croydon and piled on 189 runs to defend with our opening duo of Kyle Rayner and Jayden Clay putting on an excellent 99 for the first wicket. Jayden got 38 and Kyle a classy 63 from 89 balls... the bowlers did their work, ensuring Croydon could only manage 142 with Sam Kimber taking 4/34 and AB 3/29.

Both the 2's and 3s were well beaten (Josh Davidson batted well for 60 in the 3s) but the 4s continued their winning streak defending 154 with Peter Lazer 40 and Jason Arnberger 37 getting a few with the bat.

Round 6 - Highlights

With the 1sts, 2nds and 3rds all losing convincingly to Ormond it was left to the 4ths to win again but only by 1 run. Defending 146 proved difficult but luckily Mitchell Barnard-Brown stepped up with 4/19 with the ball.

Round 7 - Highlights

The firsts returned to winning form, thrashing Elsternwick. Again batting first, we piled on 187 from our 40 overs with Tom Newman smashing 47 (42), Kyle Rayner 46 (66) and skipper Ryan Webster 36 (61). Elsternwick could only manage 137 with Saeed grabbing 3/15 and Hayden Rayner and Blake Nikolic 2 each.

The twos also returned winners chasing down a formidable 159 with Parth Mehta again taking 4/26. Raj Kumar led the way in the chase with 44 (58) and then young gun recruit Austin Callow secured the win with 42* (69)... a great chase down win.

The 3s were washed out and the 4s easily chased down Elsternwicks 151 thanks mainly to veterans

Glenn Comte 50 and Peter Lazer 38* to remain on top of the ladder undefeated.

Round 8 - Highlights

Unfortunately, Oakleigh had the better of us in the 1s, 2s and 3s with only Tom Newman starring with 55 in the 1s. The 4ths again continued their excellent form by chasing down Oakleigh's 161... Comte and Lazar again starred with the bat to secure victory with 7 overs to spare.

Round 9 - Highlights

The Is got back on the winners list by comprehensively defeating archrivals Bayswater at home. Our score of 192, with skip Ryan Webster smashing 54 off 51 and Jayden Clay supporting with 52, was too much for Bayswater who could only get 156 in reply with Sam Kimber snagging 3/19 off 8 and Hayden Rayner picking up the key wicket of ex-Mustang Paul Gloury for 10 to finish with 2 wickets.

The twos batted brilliantly getting 193 thanks mainly to young guns Raj Kumar 68 (99) and Austin Callow 65 (87). But the bowlers couldn't restrain Bayswater with them reaching our target on the 2nd last ball of the game!

The 3s and 4s were washed out.

Round 10 - Highlights

The Is were too classy for Moorabbin, chasing down their score of 106 in just 34 overs, further securing their spot in the top 6.

The 2s and 3s had disappointing losses (Kyle Brand 42 in 3s) but again the 4ths remained undefeated with a 30-run victory

Round II - Highlights

Brighton had the wood on the Is, 2s and even the 4s lost their first match for the season but the bottom placed 3s caused a major shock by beating their 5th placed opponents. We batted first and scored a season high 219, with Michael Vozzo 73, Sam German 32 and Yash Khushalani smashing a quick fire 34 getting amongst the runs. In reply,



despite getting off to a flier, Brighton could only manage 181, with young Tristan Wainright spinning up a storm taking 3/31 off 8 and Yash Khushalani earning Man of the Match but following up his awesome batting display with 2/20 off his 8.

Round 12 - Highlights

Malvern were always going to be a tough ask and the 1s struggled against the 2nd placed team. Despite Parth Mehta and Hayden Rayner picking up 3 and 2 wickets respectively, we could only manage 121 in reply with Kyle Rayner 39 and AB 35* the pick of the bats.

The 2s had a horrid day, the 3s couldn't make it two wins in a row and unfortunately even the 4s lost despite Luke Kukuruzovic hitting up 61 and Sam Blake 45.

Round 13 - Highlights

The Is required a win to secure a spot in the finals and put on an excellent batting display getting 183 in the process. Again the skipper got amongst the runs with 55 (89) and Jayden Clay 42 (79) but Tom Newman 30 (20) and AB 25 (22) accelerated to get us a score that was always going to be difficult to chase down. In reply Endeavour Hills got to 136 with the wickets being shared around and Blake Nikolic's 8 overs, 6 maidens, 2 for 8 is worthy of a mention.

The 2s returned to the winner's circle in a dominant display dismissing E Hills for 111, Josh Barr taking 3/8 and Moose 2/15 and then chasing down in just 19 overs with Liam Dick 48* and Kyle Brand 46.

The 3s caused another shock upset win by downing their 2nd placed opponents. Batting first we compiled 4/174 with Sam German smacking up 77 and Will Hazeldine 52. In reply we had them 6/45, before they rallied somewhat to get to 149... great win by the kids.

In a shock loss the 4s went down to E Hills... couldn't chase down 129, getting to only 110... but luckily were able to secure a spot in the finals in 3rd spot despite losing their last 3 games.

The Is were pitted against Oakleigh in the first final and unfortunately were overpowered by the highly ranked opponents. Chasing 163 we were always behind the eight ball, but a 6th placed finish at seasons end was a sound result considering the calibre of players we lost from the 2019/20 season.

Credit must go to Ryan Webster for his leadership in being able to have the guys play at their best and for Richard Armstrong who was able to further improve our young talent to ensure a very competitive outfit, up against clubs who spend tens of thousands of dollars to produce results.

The 4s also took on Oakleigh and after batting first and only compiling 115, it was always going to be a struggle to win from there. Oakleigh was able to chase the score down, but luckily we achieved the double chance after finishing 3rd at seasons end.

This is where the 4ths season turned around. Up until this moment the team heavily relied on a few to either score runs or take wickets, but in this game we got an even spread of contributors to secure a win against Brighton. Making 7/163, Sam Morris as skipper steeped up with 35* (37), Steve Flinn 33 (65), Peter Lazer 26 (19) and Pas De Silva 22 (42) to ensure a formidable score. In reply Brighton fell just 5 runs short with Daniel Pietz taking 3/21 and David Blake 2/34......we were off to the Grand Final!!
