Treasurer's Report

For the Season 2021/22 the Box Hill Cricket Club recorded a \$2,938 loss. This result compares with a \$2,948 profit recorded in the season prior (2021/21). The small loss position was expected for the year and after a challenging period can be seen as a beneficial result considering the following challenges:

- Despite coming out of COVID, the incentive of waived rental fees from Whitehorse City Council were reduced due to a smaller portion of the season being lost (\$6,125 waived compared to \$15,170 in 2021)
- · COVID-related grants reduced (\$1,000 compared to \$8,000 in 2021)
- \cdot These COVID subsidies were not enough to offset the increase in social/fundraising revenue from the openings of the bar (circa \$3,000 net increase) and increase in subscriptions

Like the rest of the community, the Club faces significant near-term challenges from COVID-19 and continues to engage with key stakeholders regarding the potential financial impacts on players and the Club. In particular, the Club would like to thank the Whitehorse City Council's financial support through waiving of ground rental fees as well as the new sponsors that came on board this year to help contribute to the club.

Overall revenue decreased by \$478 to \$117,185. A great achievement contributed by increased participation numbers (particularly juniors) and opening of the bar and other social activities generating revenue. The Club continues to rely heavily on the support of Cricket Victoria through agreed Cricket Expense Reimbursements (\$31,649) and Strategic Activity Funding (\$1,000), the latter supporting the Club's investment in the Meg Lanning Academy and junior development program. The Club wishes to thank Cricket Victoria for its continued strong support of its Women's cricket program and efforts to drive further participation by females of all ages.

The lack of third-party Sponsorship is a continuing concern and needs to be a key focus of not just the Committee but the Box Hill Cricket Club

community – please approach the Committee with ideas and suggestions. The goal for the club is to return to pre-covid period of level sponsorship and driving greater relationships with the community.

Notable changes in income versus the season prior were a decrease in Subscriptions (\$3,169) and Prize Money from Cricket Victoria (\$1,000). The Club invested significantly in the Meg Lanning Academy which was mostly funded by fees (\$8,535) and Cricket Victoria Activity Funding. Jason McNulty should be commended on the huge effort he undertook to organise and manage this program under constantly changing conditions. The Club was also able to secure a number of COVID relief grants — \$4,500 from Whitehorse City Council, \$2,000 from Bendigo Bank and \$1,500 from the Victorian Government's Community Sport Sector COVID-19 Short-Term Survival Package.

Social & Fundraising profits (increased by \$2,934) were benefited by the easing of regulations and opening of social club rooms during the season on the back-end of the COVID lockdowns. I would like to personally thank the assistance provided by Michelle Winterton for managing the bar as well as the never-ending assistance provided by Brant Hubber across a number of areas at the Club.

Overall expenses increase by \$4,958 showing the overall up-keep required to run the club. However as mentioned, ground rental fees increased from prior year despite being partly waived by the Whitehorse City Council. The key increases were driven by a longer cricket season than prior year seen by increased curator costs (\$1,560), planning and fundraising expenses (\$2,976) and as mentioned ground rental. All these expenses are all expected to significantly increase in FY23 and are hoping the relevant revenue that comes with this expenditure rises at the same capacity.

Savings were made in some areas however a number were COVID-related disruptions and will be required expenditure in FY23. This includes a reduced pre-season / indoor training costs which were still significantly lower than 2019/20, clothing/club merchandise (\$2,884) and light / power / cleaning (\$1,017 lower than 2019/20). There will be increased cost pressure during FY23 that will need to be funded by additional revenue.



The Club's cash position increased by \$16,788. However, the key contributors to the difference between cash and accounting profit for FY22 were the payment of rental fees due to the late invoice being received by the club, and less balls and equipment purchased due to the large amount of prior year purchases and in particular the utilisation of the high level of balls held at 30 June 2022.

In summary, Season 2021/22 saw a minor loss, however with complete easing of restrictions the social and fundraising revenue should significantly impact the bottom line of the club in a positive manner. The club has been extremely prudent in managing its expense line for some time now and will continue to seek ways to "do things better". If we wish to grow our cricket program (men, women and juniors), continue to enhance the coaching we offer and invest in our players, we must grow the Club's income streams quite significantly for next season and into the foreseeable future.

On behalf of our members, I thank all our valued sponsors and partners, particularly the Surrey Hills Community Bank Branch of the Bendigo Bank and the continued support of Fashion Clubwear. A number of members of the Box Hill Cricket Club Community also supported the Club through donations. Your greatly appreciated support assists the club in delivering programs and initiatives to benefit our Juniors, Senior Women and Senior Men.

Notes to the Financial Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2022

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

1) Statement of Compliance

The Committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act (Victoria) 2012*.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101	Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 108	Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

2) Basis of Measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis, are based on historical cost and do not take into account changing money values except where specifically stated.

2. Specific Accounting Policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

1) Income Tax

The association is a not-for-profit organisation and is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

2) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The association is not registered for GST and is not required to be registered for GST while it's income remains under the GST threshold.

3) Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

4) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with maturities over twelve months.

5) Receivables

Receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted on an active market and are not stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.



6) Inventory

Inventory held for sale or future use is measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

7) Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Committee to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal.

8) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight-line basis over each asset's useful life to the association, commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

9) Trade Creditors and Other Payables

Trade Creditors and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days on recognition of the liability.

10) Prepaid Revenue

Prepaid revenue is revenue received in advance and represents the liability outstanding for goods and services not yet provided by the association as at the end of the reporting period.

11) Related Party Transactions

Andrew Minter, the President, holds positions in Fashion Clubwear that result in him having control or significant influence over Fashion Clubwear Pty Ltd. Fashion Clubwear Pty Ltd transacted with the association during the year through its role as clothing supplier and sponsor. The terms and conditions of these transactions were no more favourable than those available, or which might reasonably be expected to be available, in similar transactions with non-key management personnel related companies on an arm's length basis.



Declaration by Members of the Committee

The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity and that this special purpose financial report should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Notes 1 and 2 to the financial report.

In the opinion of the Committee, the financial report presents a true and fair view of the financial position of Box Hill Cricket Club Inc. as at 30 June 2022 and its performance for the year then ended.

During the post-Christmas period, as with many clubs, COVID began to impact upon playing numbers due to unavailability & throughout this period our results were impacted, particularly our IstXI, which experienced difficulty containing our opposition with the ball & posting competitive scores with the bat.

Throughout early 2022, our 3rdXI enjoyed what could be considered their best win of the season when Captain Nicole Breschkin with 71 n.o. & club stalwart Michelle Winterton 98 n.o. shared an unbroken partnership of 201 in a defeat of Plenty Valley Cricket Club.

Our Community team also posted their first victory for the season in Round 7 against Heatherdale Cricket Club.

With 4 rounds remaining & sitting outside the top 4 it was do or die time for our IstXI & fortunately during this period we secured the services of English international Kirstie Gordon who immediately had a profound impact upon not only the IstXI but the entire playing group with her professional attitude & desire to maintain high standards.

Over the ensuing 3 rounds we played our very best cricket for the season, which included an outstanding team effort against a strong Dandenong Cricket Club outfit with the majority of their contracted players available & then defeating eventual premiers Melbourne Club Cricket at home on the back of a superb captain's knock by Zoe Griffiths of 79 n.o.

We recorded mixed results from our other XI's throughout the aforementioned period as a compressed season & the hotter weather began to take a toll particularly on the younger members of our playing group. The equation was simple for our IstXI heading into the final round game against Essendon Maribyrnong Park Cricket Club, specifically win & rely on other results favouring us.

After posting a mediocre total & the opposition then building strong partnerships & appearing in control of the run chase we refused to give up & continued to believe which saw us take a remarkable 8/20 in a chaotic finish & win by 3 runs.

With results from other games favouring us we snuck into 4th position & a finals berth.

Our 2ndXI also qualified for finals finishing 2nd on the ladder guaranteeing a home final.

In a superb bowling & fielding performance in the Semi Final which included 2 run outs our 2ndXI were able to defeat quality opponents Dandenong Cricket Club at home to qualify for a Grand Final against the yardstick of the competition Melbourne Cricket Club.

Having approached & played the final 4 rounds of the season as basically a knock out final our performance in the Semi Final against Melbourne Cricket Club was not what we had hoped it would be as we experienced difficulty building partnerships

We fought hard to post a competitive total in the 2ndXI Grand Final, however, were ultimately overwhelmed by the depth of talent possessed by Melbourne Cricket Club & to see the disappointment of the result on the players faces was testament to their character along with their desire to achieve premiership success for both themselves individually & the club collectively.

Highlights
Rounds I – 4

Rounds 5 – 10

Emma again took a couple of early wickets and our spinning duo of Lani and Vaish took 6 between them to bowl Prahran out for 88. A fantastic drive home from Geelong after taking 20 wickets for the day. vs Plenty Valley: We restricted PV to 5/66 in the first of two T20 games for the day and quickly chased down the target in the 9th over with the loss of only one wicket. Katherine top scored with a quickfire 33*.

vs EMP: Following an absolute downpour, the game was reduced to a TII. We sent EMP into bat and had them 5/5 before they went on to score 7/42. Katherine and Amelie got us home in the 9th over following a solid 20 run partnership. vs Geelong: We were sent into bat for our first onedayer in over a month. A very well-rounded batting display saw Pennie make 35 and 12 year old Lily Parker an important 17* to take our total to 6/192. With Geelong dominating the first few rounds, we knew defending wouldn't be an easy task, however, with 4 wickets from Emma and 2 from debutant Tanya, we bowled them out for 122. vs Prahran: In what seemed to be perfect batting conditions on a forecasted day of 31 degrees, Prahran was on the back foot early at 5/58 and were eventually bowled out in the 28th over for 74. Ladder position and win-loss records did not make for good reading this season for a young 3rd eleven team that struggled to find its feet. Michael Vozzo returned from retirement to assist with the development of the club's next generation following the departure of several players over an offseason impacted by pandemic restrictions for a second straight year. Unfortunately for Voz, his battle-weary body could not quite hold up to another season of cricket, however, the knowledge and leadership he instilled on the boys will no doubt prove invaluable to the club's future. Week in, week out, the boys would compete against opposition teams forgoing hundreds of games, and decades of experience in what proved to be a highly competitive division. The team's average age hovered between 16 and 20 throughout much of the season. At times, age proved no barrier as the boys competed in several key moments throughout the season. Consistency, however, remained the greatest barrier to converting some of these moments into victories. Despite the limited success experienced by the team, there were several highlights throughout the season where the club's next generation showcased their talent.

Luke Myszka returned for a handful of games this season to help sure up numbers (boosting the average age in the process!) and provided another mature head to lead the development our younger top order batsman. He capped his year off with a 101 against Donvale Cricket Club in round six, along his way to a total of 269 runs at an average of 44.83 for the season.

Tristan Wainwright continued to impress with his work ethic at training and split his time between the 2nd and 3rd elevens this season. Tristan teamed up with Luke against Donvale for a partnership of 161 runs, bringing up his own century (108*) in the process. Remarkably, Tristan had never passed 50 before this moment. He also picked up a maiden senior five-wicket haul in the first game of the season against Port Melbourne, finishing with figures of 5/33 off nine overs.

Raphael Cramb delivered the team's best bowling figures of the year in a sensational display of off-spin bowling in the final round of the season. Raph finished the match with figures of 5/2 off seven consecutive overs, including four maidens. In conditions not overly friendly for spinners given the amount of overnight rain, Raph demonstrated tremendous control and nuance, especially with his changes in speed and flight.

Finally, the youngest member of the team, Tommy Vozzo, put up a fine display of swing bowling (reminiscent of his old man!) on his way to a maiden five wicket haul in a dominant team display against Donvale Cricket Club in round six. Tommy finished with figures of 5/29 off six overs. Tommy often proved a challenging prospect for opposition batsman, especially when his outswinger was on target.

There were plenty of other significant contributions throughout the season. Big Wilbur (Will Hazeldine) frequently proved he had the ability to shift the momentum of a game with either bat, or ball and has hopefully developed the confidence in his abilities to push for higher honors next season. The Reed brothers (Dillon, and Tom) proved to be a dynamic bowling duo whether deployed at the start, or close of an innings, and continued to refine their skills each week. KB (Kyle Brand) showed his versatility after a rocky start to the season with the bat, dropping down the order to provide some late-inning fireworks, whilst also delivering crucial middle overs with the ball – and the occasional opening spell! Mayekar grew in confidence as the season progress, bringing up a well-deserved 70 against a strong Elsternwick side in round seven. He also proved to be quite the dynamic fielder in the gully, pouncing on anything within reach. Both Brin, and Baz demonstrated their respective talents throughout the season, and both will prove to be



valued members of the club going forward. Teaming up with young Tommy, Jakey's Peitz and Sheehan also proved age (and size!) to be no barrier in playing senior cricket. Whether it was with the ball, or holding steadfast in defence with bat in hand, both boys will be sure to have success going forward. Finally, I would like to thank our curator, Ben Hammond, for not only playing, but producing some of the best wickets Springfield Park has seen in years. His season came to life when he made the switch to from leg spin to fast bowling, showing a turn of pace and late swing that troubled many top order batsmen towards the end of the season. I apologise if I have missed any other players who represented the team this season. I greatly appreciate your contributions.

I would like to thank Michael for his ongoing support throughout the season. I know that the competitive beast within him was frustrated at the lack of personal and team performance this season, but that did not stop him from supporting from the sidelines every week. I would also like to extend my appreciation to the efforts of Scott Wainwright this season. Men's Fourth XI Report

2021/22 saw a new format in the lower grades with the competition being split into two divisions for the first time. After wining the premiership in 2020/21 it was a bit of a surprise to find ourselves in the second division but we had large changes to the squad from last season due to retirement, players leaving and most pleasingly elevation through the grades. These changes saw a largely different squad in the current year but we were still able to have a successful season albeit with a disappointing end in losing in the grand final. The large changes were highlighted by only two players appearing in both grand finals.

The home and away season was one of mixed results. We finished the season with a record of 7 wins, 5 losses and 2 draws to finish in 4th position. However, when you break results down further all 7 wins and I draw came in our games against the bottom 4 and we had a less than flattering 0 wins, I draw and 5 losses against the other finalists.

The finals saw us meet top of the table Croydon in the semi final, who had comfortably beaten us twice during the season. After a promising start where we were 2/96 we lost 6/8 before a match wining partnership from Robbo(24*) and AJ (19*) got us up to 8/159. Despite bowling 41 wides we were able to win our way through to the grand final after bowling Croydon out for 106.

The grand final saw us bat first and despite some good innings from Hubber (35) and Barge (26) we only managed to get to 126 all out. This was probably 20 or 30 less than what we thought was par on the wicket. With the ball our young attack was fantastic and we kept them to 2/40 at drinks and we were still in the game. However, we just couldn't get the breakthroughs we needed and they were able to get home with a few overs to go to see us finish runners up. A great effort with such as young team.

Throughout the season we were inconsistent with the bat but some of the highlights of the home and away season were a 4th XI club record unbeaten opening partnership of 175 against Moorabin (which included an unbeaten 68* from Barathan); 63 from Avi in a win against Moorabin, Robbo's 50 in a loss to Balwyn; and Tom Reed (67) and Comte (75 off

49 balls) sealing a spot in the finals with a great partnership in a must win game against Donvale.

We ended the year with 4 of the top 8 leading run scorers in the competition and Tom Reed deservedly won the batting trophy with 204 runs at 25.50.

For the majority of the season our bowling attack was led by Robbo and supported by a host of young promising bowlers. The season saw Robbo (3/25), Jakey Pietz (4/10 in the semi final and 3/12), AJ (3/31), Avi (4/17) and Dillon Reed (3/29 in the semi final) all finish a game with 3 or more wickets. Tom Reed Aarth Guha and Jakey Sheehan also bowled some great spells throughout the season. Whilst this provided us with lots of opportunities there were games where we conceded too many free runs through extras.

Jakey Pietz was our most consistent bowler, when he was not filling in with the gloves, and won his bowling trophy taking his wickets at 17 a piece.

It was always pleasing to me that, compared to the other sides in the competition, we had a far greater reliance on youth which is a real promising sign for the club going forward. Many of the Fourth XI will be able to continue to progress through the grades and ultimately look to play in the First XI in future seasons. The club will continue to provide opportunities for our young players to progress and in the Fourth XI we have looked to balance development with team success. This approach saw 3 players that represented the Fourth XI last season making First XI debuts in 21/22 and another 4 play in the Second XI. In total 12 players that played in the First XI this season had

progressed through the Fourth XI or our Craig Shield program which should provide motivation for our promising young prospects to continue to develop their cricket at Box Hill.
